



Bin 28 Kalimna Shiraz

1993

Penfolds Kalimna Bin 28 is a classic Australian Shiraz named after Penfolds' famous vineyard in the Barossa Valley.

The 1993 Kalimna is an excellent example of the traditional Bin 28 style and a great successor to the outstanding previous 1990's releases. It was made from premium Shiraz grapes grown predominantly in the Barossa Valley, including the low yielding Penfolds' Kalimna Vineyard, with the balance selected from other renowned South Australian wine districts to provide the full spectrum of varietal aromas and flavours necessary to create this very complex wine.
