



Koonunga Hill Shiraz Cabernet 1999

First made in 1976, Penfolds Koonunga Hill was conceived as a red wine for consumption in the year following its release. However, time has shown that it also has good cellaring prospects.

In the mid-1990s Koonunga Hill moved up a step in the hierarchy but before that was Penfolds' 'entry-level' red. It is a multi-district blend, usually Barossa Valley-dominant, and takes its name from an important vineyard purchased by Penfolds in 1973.

Proportions of shiraz and cabernet are varied widely to maintain consistency of style, but shiraz is always dominant. Penfolds Koonunga Hill symbolises affordable Australian red wine quality.
